QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

QUESTION: *I own a 1967 Mustang coupe that has an erratic heater problem. Sometimes it heats just fine and other times it never reaches the proper temperature. What do you attribute this to?*

ANSWER: This condition can be caused by improper retention of the heater control cables to the damper door pivot arms. Occasionally the cable will kink or will slide off the pivot arm resulting in inoperative damper doors. The problem could also be caused by a plugged or bad heater core, or a thermostat not functioning properly. Seeing your problem is intermittent I would suggest starting with the cables.

QUESTION: *My clutch squeaks badly on my '65 coupe. I use WD-40 on the linkage but it only helps for a short time. What's the cure?*

ANSWER: If your clutch pedals rattles or squeaks and does not return to the proper height specified in your shop manual there is a good chance you should replace the upper and lower spring insulators on the over center clutch spring. It's probably a good idea to change this on all early Mustangs if they are still original..
