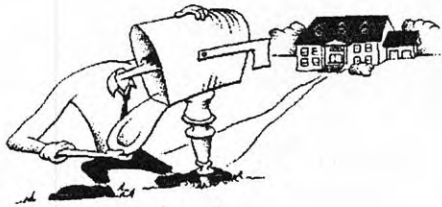

### *Upcoming Over The Road Trips*

The W.E.M. has scheduled 4 over the road trips for the '97 season. Two day trips, one (1) niter and one two niter. The first trip will take place on Saturday June 7th. A destination for this trip has not as yet been set. Due to the short time period we will have to act fast to get a headcount once this trip is set. The second trip, a one niter, will take place on Saturday June 28th and Sunday June 29th. This is being planned for the Mississippi River area. There will be a sign-up in next newsletter. The third trip is another one day outing planned for Saturday September 20th. The destination for this trip has yet to be determined. Our final OTR trip will be our annual trip to Door County. This will be a two niter October 3rd thru the 5th. Please make sure you respond quickly if you intend to participate in any of these outings, as it is necessary to lock in reservations.

### *Car Show Swap For Charity*

It was brought out at the April meeting that the sign up for vendors at this years show was low. It appears that many vendors who would normally set up at our show have chosen the show and swap being held in Waukesha on the same day. This could be a critical blow to this years revenue as the swap area normally netted over \$600 each year. The group who were in attendance at the April meeting felt that if the vendor count remained low it would be impractical to charge the normal \$1.00 admission to the swap area. It was also suggested and approved that the club set up our own swap areas for members. The proceeds from this swap space would go to the Special Olympics. So here is how this space will be laid out and run. If any member has Mustang parts they would like to contribute to the cause bring them along to the show or to the set up on Saturday. Mark each part as to the estimated value. These parts will be displayed in the clubs swap area and sold the day of the show. The swap area will be manned by someone who had volunteered to help out in the vendor area. After the show ends on Sunday all proceeds from our booth will be sent to the Special Olympics charity. If you plan to participate in donating items to the show please call Bob Zimmermann at 414-761-2007. We would like to have a rough idea, in advance, as to how many parts we will be selling. Now is the time to get out to the garage and box up those Mustang parts that have been in your way for the past 10 years.

The group was reminded to meet at MacDonaldis on highway 83 and I94 at 10:00AM sharp. It is about a half hour trip to Pine Knoll from there. There will be another trip to Bob Perkins after the brunch for anyone who may be interested.
- It was reported that a lack of vendors for our show raises a concern. There is a conflict with the Waukesha show and swap which have many vendors heading to Waukesha. To date only one vendor has signed up. It was recommended that we do not charge for the swap area if the vendor count remains small. It was also recommended that our Club procure a swap space and have all members donate car parts they may wish to dispose of. The proceeds of our spot would be donated to the Special Olympics.
- A destination for the June 7th one day trip has not as yet been determined.
- Scott stated the sweatshirts ordered the past few months should be soon. If you are interested in a sweatshirt that has our 10th annual show emblem embroidered on the front contact Scott The cost will be \$45. Sizes range from small to XXX large.
- Bob Zimmermann reminded all, that we need more goodies for the goodie bag.

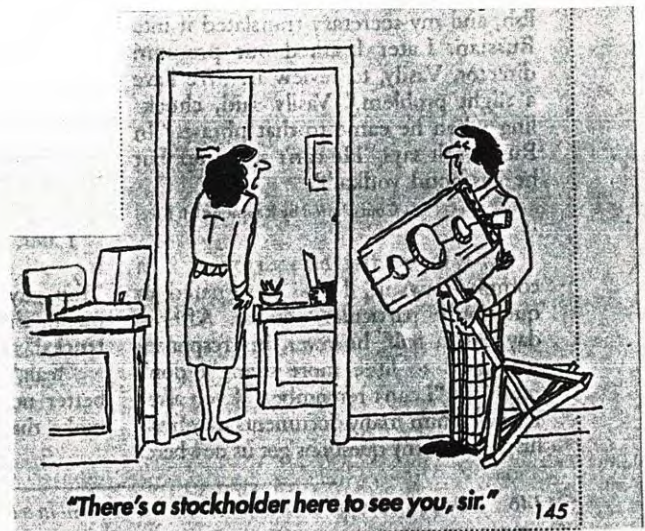
