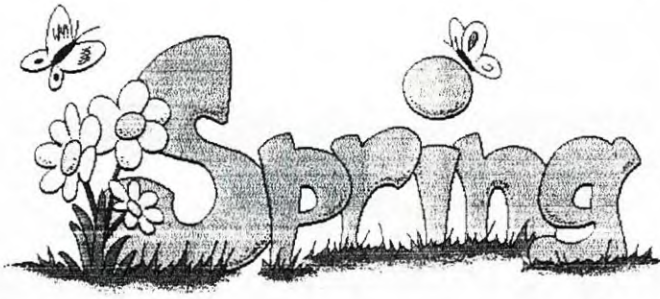

" CHARLOTTE or BUST "

(I know Maybe not the best title)

Our Mission - To attend the 35th Anniversary Mustang Celebration in Charlotte, NC on April 15 - 18 , 1999.

Our Goal - To make it down there in one piece , us and our '84 20th Anniversary Mustang Convertible :-)

The following is true story. What you are reading really did happen. None of the names or places have been changed to protect the innocent ;-)

OK . . . OK . . . I got carried away there for a moment. Seeing as Tammy and I chose to be married on April 17, 1994 , we weren't able to attend the 30th Anniversary Mustang Celebration. So what more romantic way to spend our 5th wedding anniversary than a Mustang show :-)

We started making plans back in fall of last year to attend the big show. About the only thing that I could not really decide on , was do we take the '84 and put all those miles on it driving down. Well I finally decided to go for it and to hell with the miles ! I finally got to putting the good tires and wheels back on the car on that Monday. I hadn't even started the car in a couple of months, much less driven it. Oh well, I got the the car all together and started it up. OK, it was running YEAH !!! I took it out for a drive and to get the oil changed. First part of our mission accomplished , we had a running car to drive down :-)

We decided to get an early start on Wednesday , 4:30 am departure time, and see how far we could drive. The entire trip is just under 900 miles from our door. We made it down to Ashville, NC the first day , which only left us a couple of hours of driving to get to Charlotte the next day. Well wouldn't you know that it started to rain on Thursday at 5:30 am and by the time we reached Charlotte the car was a mess. But hey , it's nothing a little water and scrubbing wouldn't take care of. The car ran great all the way down there. If you've never had the chance to take a trip through the mountains in Kentucky and North Carolina, I'd recommend that drive to anyone ! It's beautiful.

Well we made it into Charlotte mid day on Thursday and it looked as if Mustangs had taken over the city. You couldn't turn around without bumping into a Mustang. It was GREAT !!!! After we got checked in, we took a trip out to the Charlotte Motor Speedway where the show was being held. There were already 100's of cars in place for the show. It was absolutely fantastic.

Friday was the first day of the show. We headed down with the car and spent the morning getting it all cleaned up and ready for the show. We ran into some old friends and made a bunch of new ones. It's nice to be able to start a conversation with anyone by saying ... " So, what Mustang do you own :-)" . We spent most of the afternoon walking around looking at the cars and checking out all the stuff for sale in the swap. I was in heaven !!! On Friday night we attended a party put on by Steve and Liz Saleen. They went all out and there were a lot of people there.

By Saturday the show was hopping ! The cars were arriving faster than you could look at them. I couldn't believe the cars that were showing up. The mix was probably 50 / 50 when it came to early and late model Mustangs. There was a '64 1/2 Mustang Indy Pace Car hardtop that showed up. There were two '68 1/2 Cobra Jet Fastback Drag Cars that were built and raced by Tasca Ford. There were a number of Police Mustangs in attendance. There were more SVT Cobras than you could count. It was absolutely amazing. One of the things that took place on Saturday was the unveiling of the '00 SVT Cobra R-Model. Ford unveiled the car along with the 35th Anniversary Edition Mustang at 2 pm. After they finally got all the people away from the Cobra R, they took it out on the track for some laps. They wouldn't give us too much info, but I did hear that it will have a 5.4 supercharged engine with a 6 speed trans backing it up ! We spent the last part of the day looking at show cars. It took us three hours just to walk half of the car show field. We had to stop so we could get back to the hotel and attend the evening banquet sponsored by FORD :-)

The main speaker at the banquet was Jim O'Conner , VP of Ford Division. He gave a great presentation and assured all of us that the Mustang would be around for a lot of years to come and that it would remain rear wheel drive !! That got a standing round of applause :-)

Sunday was the final day of the show. Unofficially, there were 5900 Mustangs in attendance and over 75,000 people. What a great time ! We took an " Award of Excellence " with our car which was really great. We finished walking the show field on Sunday and decided to pack it up and head back. I can't tell you how much fun we had. The weather was beautiful and everyone we met was as nice as could be. We hope that in another five years , there will be a 40th Anniversary Celebration and we will be at that one for our 10th Anniversary :-)

The drive back was long, but everything went great and we made it back by mid day on Monday. Both Tammy and I were glad to be home :-)
