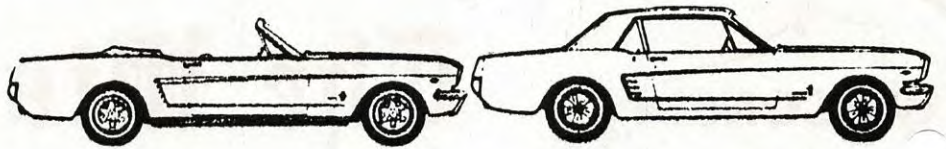
Don't forget that we are in the final countdown for our newsletter business card advertisers. For only \$35 we'll put a card in for at least 12 issues, usually more.
