From the Prez.

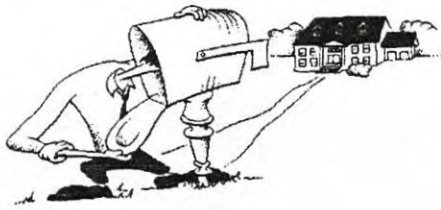
