

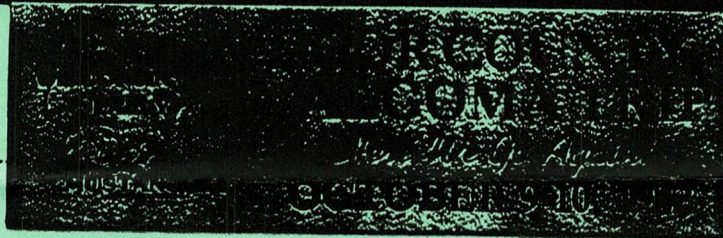
ONE DAY TRIP TO LONG GROVE, ILL. AND TO JOE AND KAREN
