

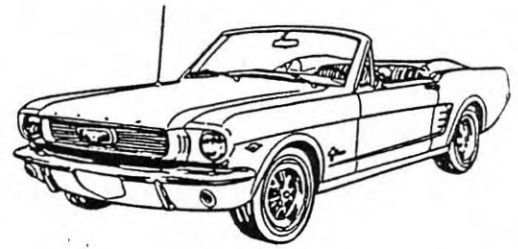

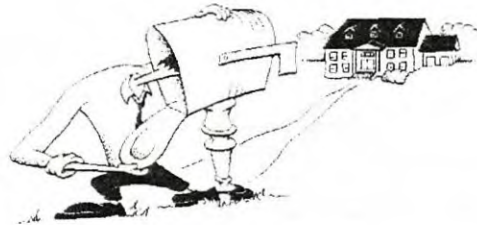

- A report was given on the Vintage Car Show held at Brooks Steven's Museum in Mequon on Sunday August 6th. 7 mustangs were represented at this show. British cars were prevalent at this showing. The Auto museum was a special treat to all who went through it.
- A few from our group motored to Wisconsin Dells for their annual show. 135 cars were entered. Mostly late model. Congratulations go to Fritz Dow 1st place, Scott Moen 2nd place, Doug Dorn 3rd place and Jeff Niebor 3rd place. This may be the last show held in the Dells as getting help to organize and run this event has been becoming more difficult.
- The club was reminded of the Northwoods Shelby event which takes place on Sept. 16 - 17. Scott and Fritz plan to be there and put on a Mini show of limited edition Mustangs. More information will be published in the newsletter.

- The October and November meetings will be important to attend.. At the October's club meeting nominations for club officers will take place. The election will take place at the November meeting. Also at the November meeting we will set up the '96 club calendar.

9:00 - 10:00 a.m. Return to the track for a minimal day of showing your car.

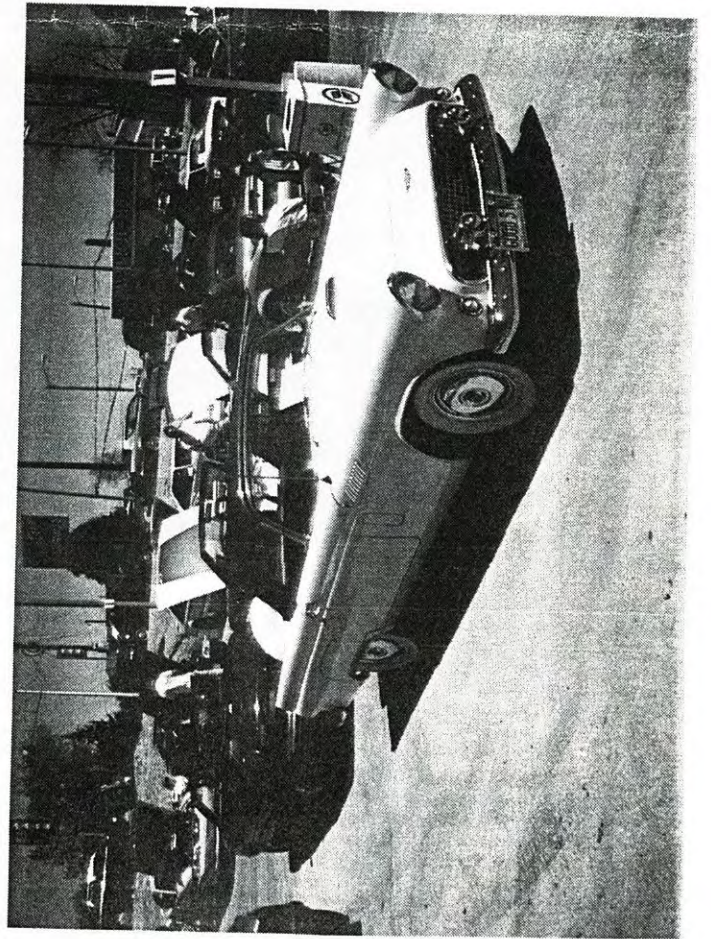
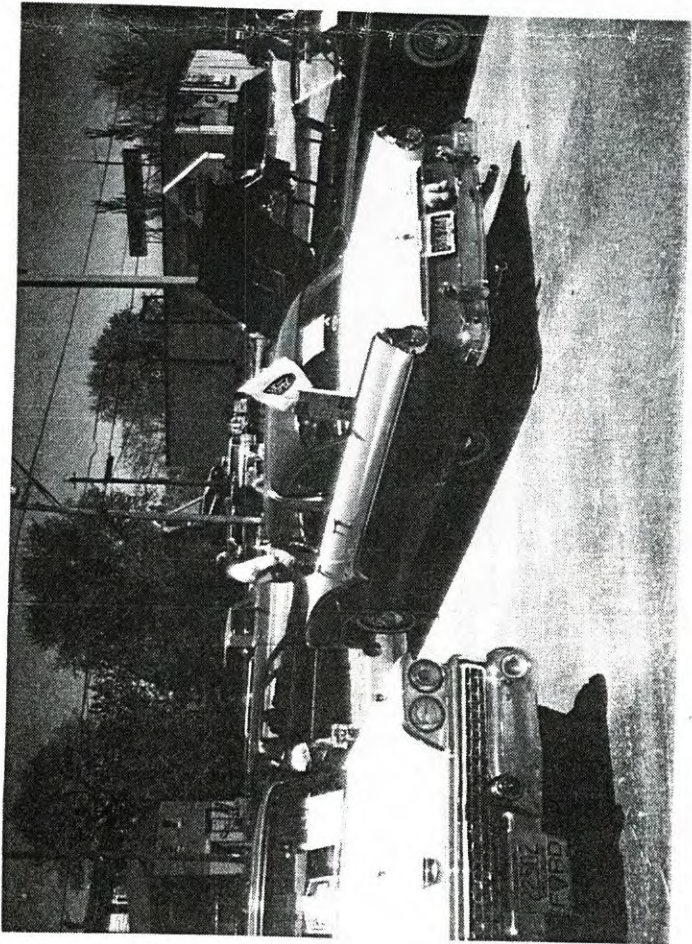
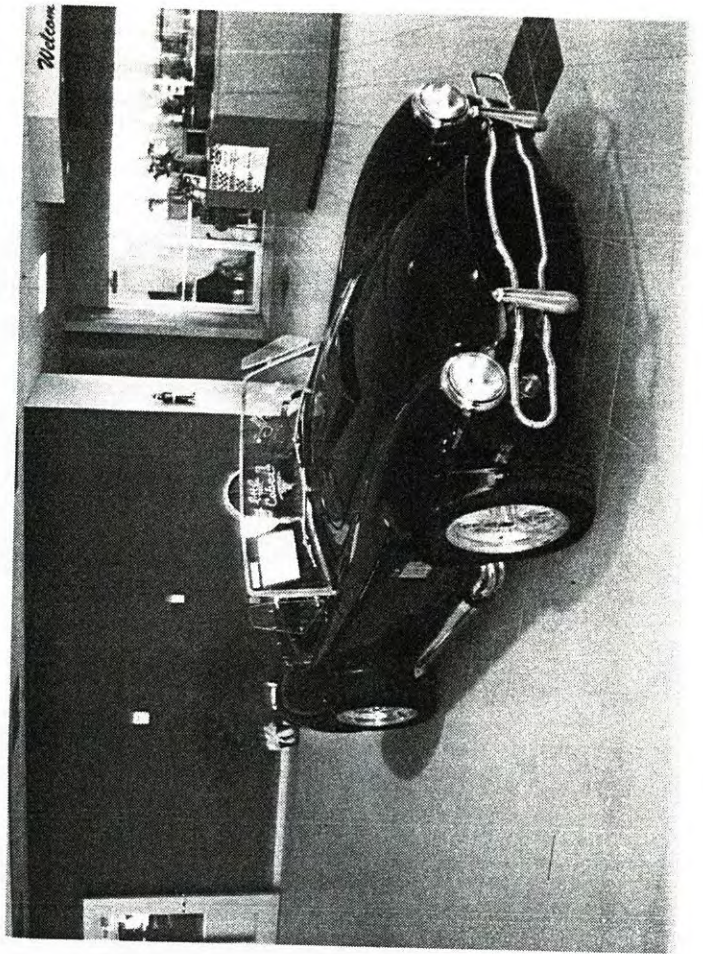
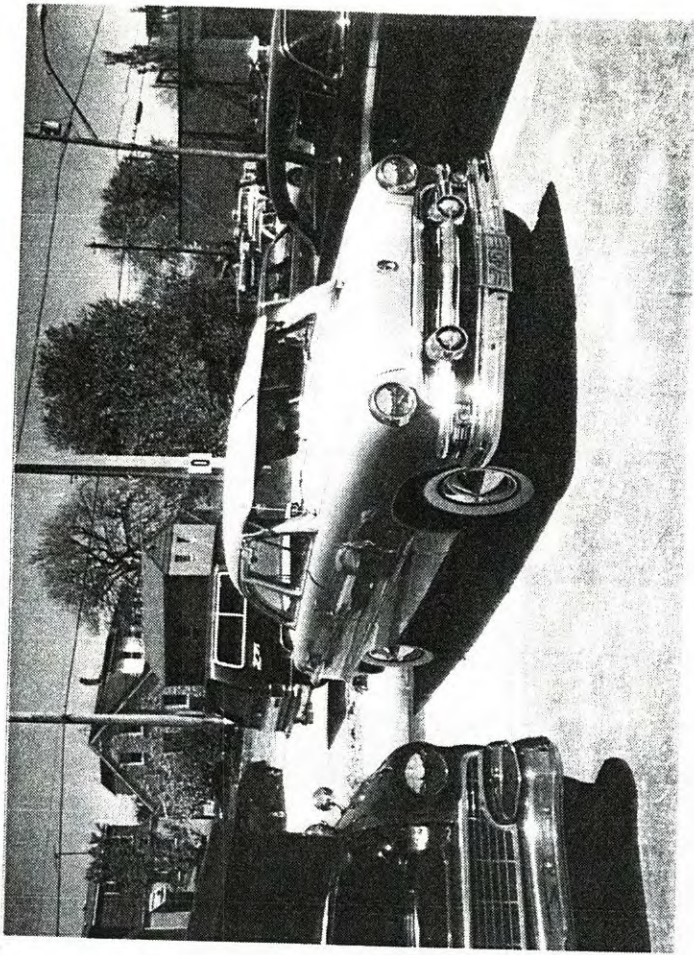

Noon - Parade laps of the track as time allows and with the permission of Northwoods SAAC directors.

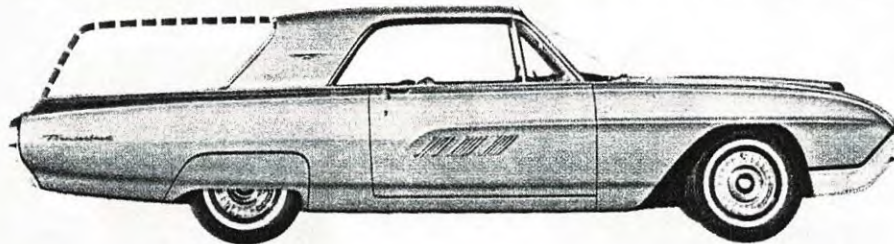
