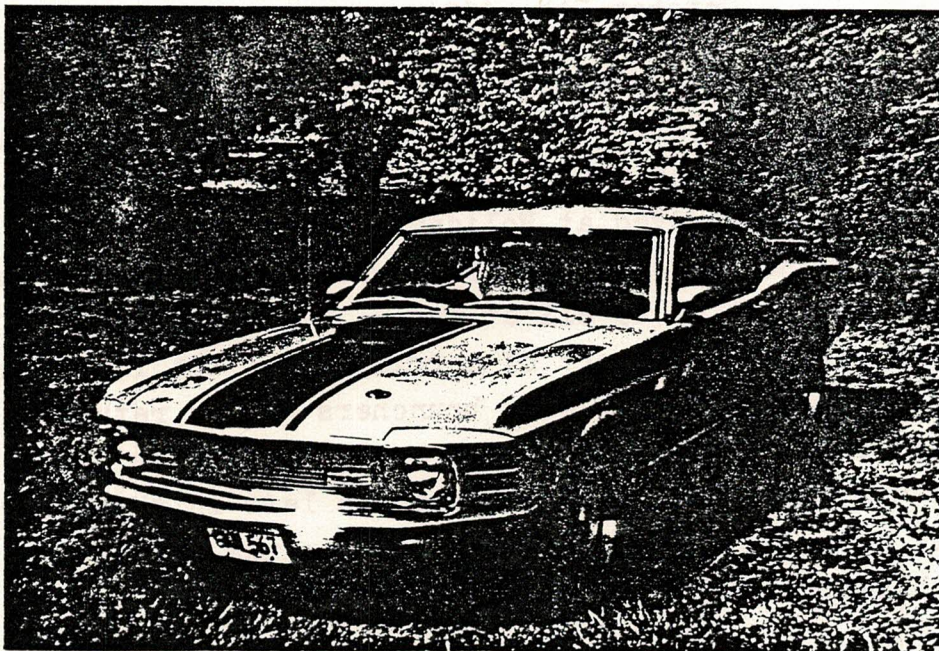

Carrot Pie

Carrots are so plentiful and cheap all year round, so this carrot pie makes a
nice substitute for that traditional pumpkin pie.

2½ cups sliced carrots (about 1 lb.)
cooked and drained

½ teaspoon each cinnamon, ginger
and nutmeg

½ cup sugar

1 ¾ cups milk

1 egg

Unbaked 9-inch pie shell

1 teaspoon salt

Whipped topping for garnish

Beat together all ingredients, except pie shell and topping, until well blended
and smooth. (Mixer, food processor or blender can be used.) Pour into pie shell
and bake in preheated 450° oven 10 minutes. Reduce temperature to 300° and bake
50 minutes or until filling is firm. Coll on rack. Garnish with topping; and
sprinkle with nutmeg.
