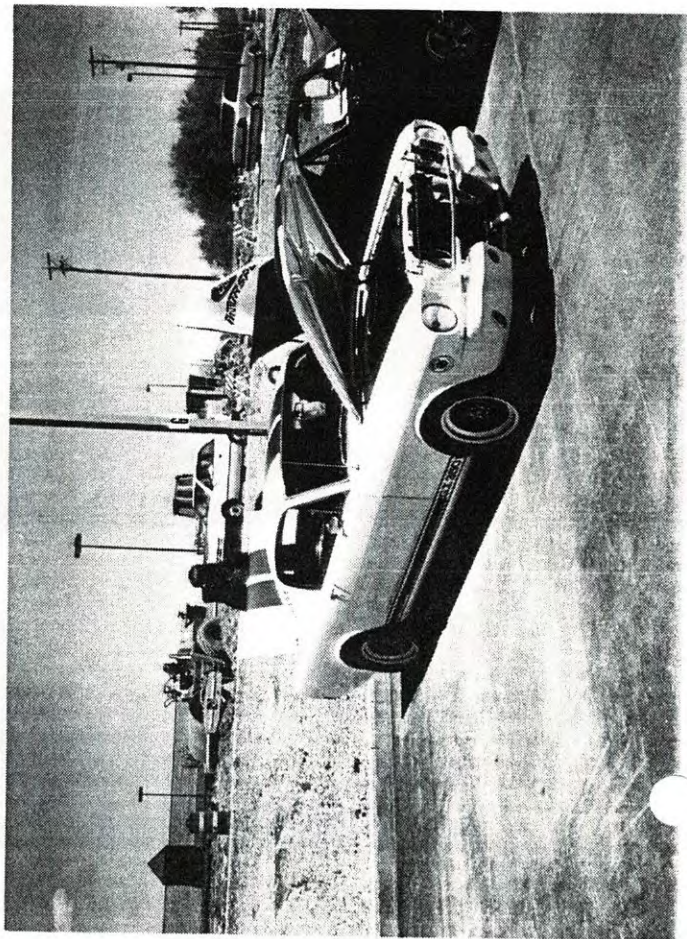
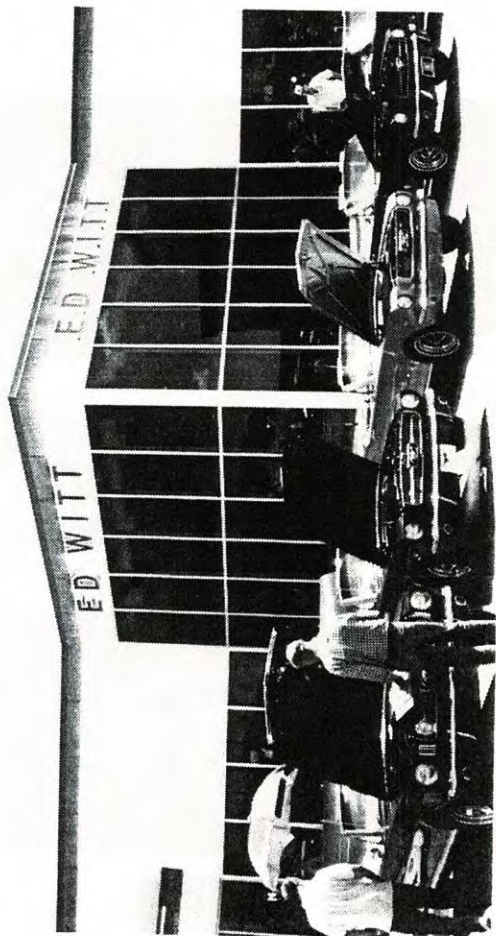
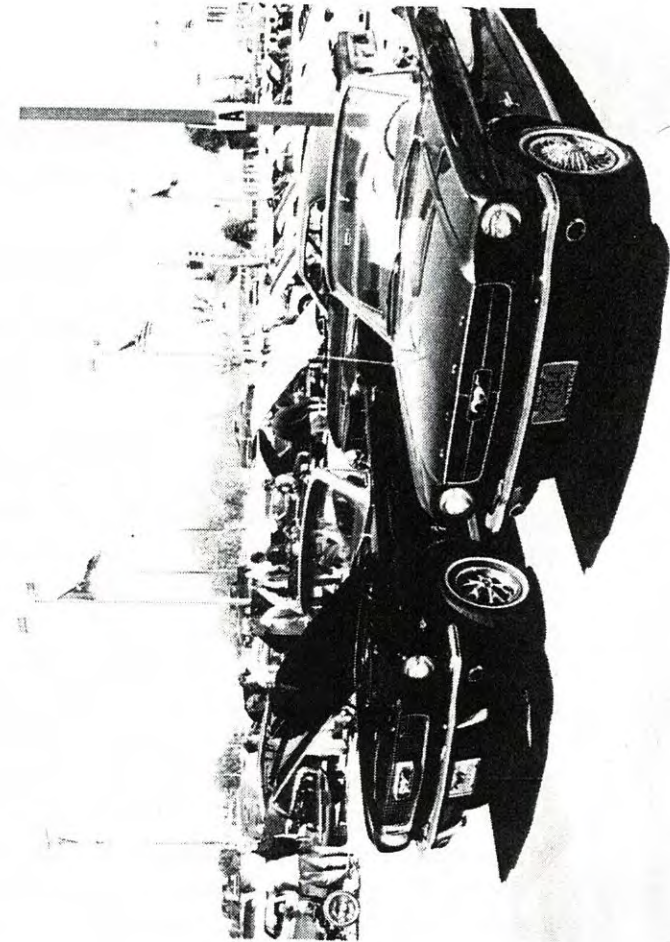
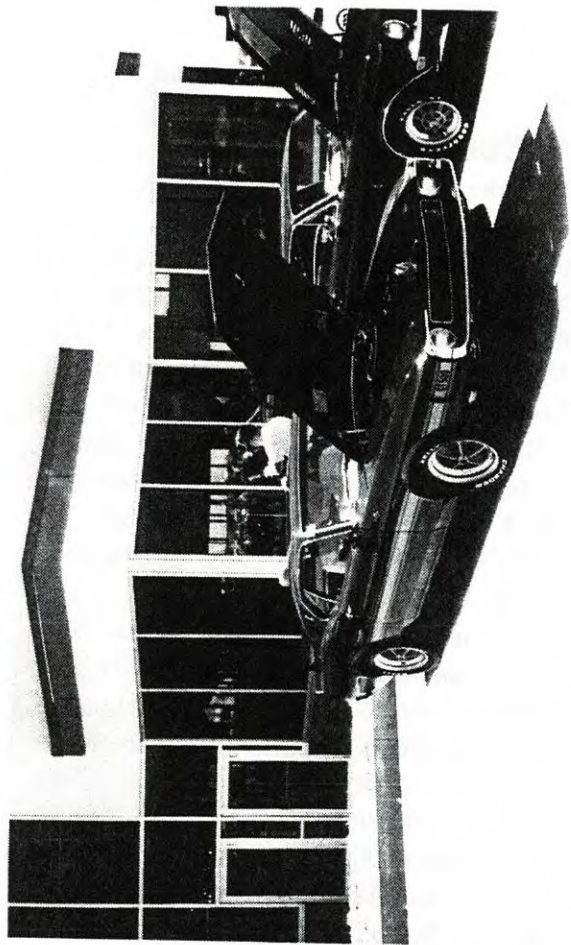
1969 MUSTANG GRANDÉ

My custom 1969 Mustang Grandé was "restored" in 1994 after suffering a severe accident (approx. \$6,000 damage). I considered the Meadowlark Yellow color a bit drab, and instead chose 1993/94 Chrome (Canary) Yellow clearcoat. It has a 351 Windsor 4V, C6 race-modified transmission, 9" traction-lok axle, Edelbrock Performer manifold and 600 cfm carburetor, and Hooker headers with functional Thrush side pipes. Cosmetic add-ons include: front and rear Mustang spoilers; hood scoop; Keystone Klassic chrome wheels with spinners; recessed locking hood pins; and custom-painted pin striping with lettering of the car's name, "Angélique" on both rear quarters. The name Angélique is from the late '60's, early '70's soap opera *Dark Shadows*. Angélique was a beautiful blonde witch who cast spells and curses, manipulating those around her. She was killed at least three times, each time returning in a more indestructible and terrifying form (vampire, ghost). The interior remains stock except for the walnut reproduction steering wheel and AM/FM cassette.

I purchased the car in August of 1985 in rough, but restorable condition from Marv Hack, a WI Early Mustanger who told me about the club. Two days later at my first WEM meeting, I met Tom Wagner whom I would later marry. I thoroughly enjoy showing the car at the local and Northern Illinois Ford shows since its facelift. I drive it to work regularly in the summer on days with good weather. After being under Angélique's spell for 10 years and umpteen thousand dollars, I'm not sure who owns who!

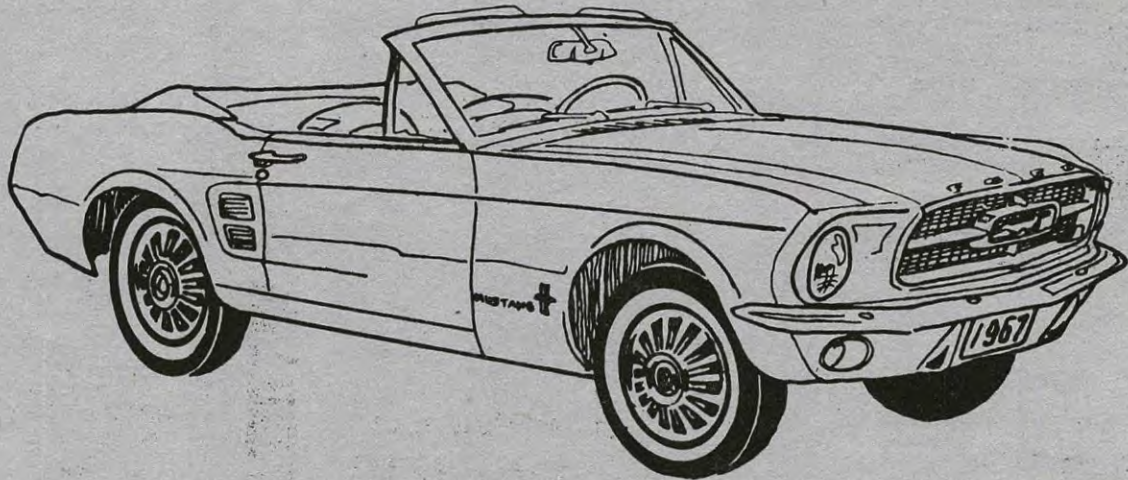

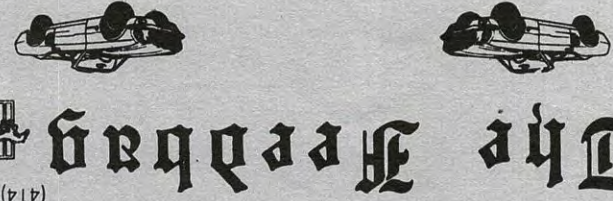
