NOVEMBER 25, 1985

The Meeting was called to order by acting President Sal Lorino at 7:35 PM in the excused absence of Dick Doria and Bob Zimmerman.

Minutes of the October 28, 1985 Membership Meeting were read by acting secretary J.R. Manning in the excused absence of Secretary Kelly Beauparland. A correction to the minutes was made by Ron Neissner, regarding the low cost jackets found by Pete Yoss. Rich ^{BRUN} (Same Guy as Above) made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Motion seconded by John Mauritz. Motion carried.


The meeting was adjourned at 7:55 PM.

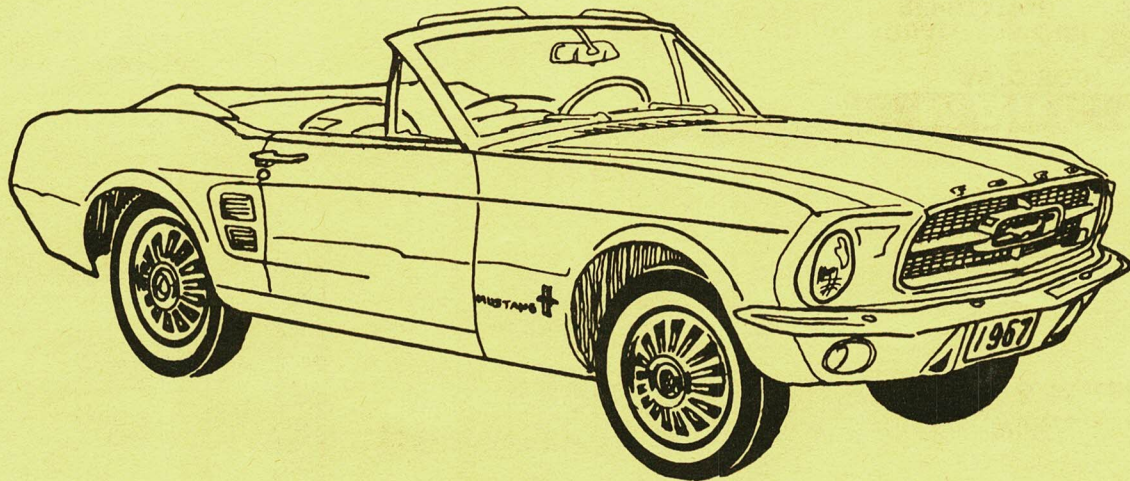
