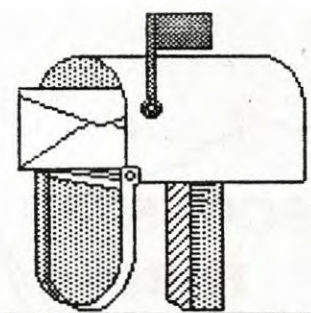

My story starts with a phone call from my father. He rarely gets excited, but after listening to him talk about this '68 Mustang that an insurance client of his wanted to sell I had to see the car. This treasure ended up to be an S-coded GT with the original 390-4V. The car had a total of 77000 miles on it. Restoration was completed eight years ago. During that time numerous items were replaced.

The complete GT package adorns this car, along with a AM 8 track, an electric antenna that raises by a switch located next to the manual clock. New polyglas F-70/14 tires were included in the deal.

The car was DSO'd in Davenport Iowa. It found its' way to upper Wisconsin where a single gal owned it for three years. It was then sold and moved on to Waukesha where most of the restoration took place.

Future plans include stripping and repainting the exterior as well as detailing the engine compartment. Otherwise it is ready to enjoy.
