QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

QUESTION: *I have been considering changing the carpet in my '66 coupe and have been wondering if I should replace or eliminate the carpet underlayment. What is your advice?*

ANSWER: Anyone who attended our last club meeting was treated to a very thorough presentation by Pete Yoss on the Dos & Don'ts of installing a carpet. It was brought out at this time that it is recommended that you replace the old fabric underlayment with a underlayment kit which is readily available through most parts outlets. This replacement kit consists of pre-cut rubber underlayment which has most of the necessary holes pre-cut as well. The heavier rubber replacement add an additional noise deadener which cuts down on road noise. I suggest that you plan this project on a warm day allowing the underlayment to set in the sun for a while, making it easier to work with..

QUESTION: *I store my car each winter, but try to start it and let it run for 5 minutes every two weeks or so. Is this a good practice?*

ANSWER: If you store your car for an extended period of time, especially winter, starting it periodically and letting it run is not a bad practice. I hedge to say that 5 minutes of running may be worse than not running at all.. It is important that your engine reaches full operating temperature and maintained for 15- 20 minutes.. A short burst of engine heat causes condensation, which will do more damage than not starting the car at all.. If possible when you start, and run, your car during a storage period put it in gear moving from forward to reverse occasionally. This will aid in keeping your seals lubricated.
