The entire restoration of this classic '66 Mustang was covered in detail by Jack Yaeger and Roger Beavers. I might point out that they did a super job in explaining the requirements needed to totally restore a Mustang.

Next issue to discuss is one of emission control in the State of Wisconsin. It appears that this could be a controversial issue for most car club members. I would like to start out by stating that I took our '89 Tempo in for the annual check last week. I figured while I was there I would talk to the people in charge about the pending legislation which could have an impact on people of our status. I was given a courteous reception at the local emissions center. The people in charge reassured me that the final chapter has not been written, and our legislators are still pondering the proper avenue to pursue. I did learn however, that the proposals would not radically effect old car enthusiasts, as the level of acceptance changes as the car gets older. In my evaluation of this initial visit, the changes will protect us not harm us. The old cars trying to pass themselves off as collector cars, whose owners must maintain certain standards, will be the ones that are liable to the extra costs. Cars such as ours would have nothing to worry about, as we keep our vehicles tuned and running well. I received a letter from one of our club members that puts this whole issue in a proper perspective. I received it too late to edit and include in this edition, but will publish it in its entirety in the next Feedbag.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

QUESTION: *I own a 1965 Mustang Convertible. My convertible has two round bars in the engine compartment which run from the front edge of the cowl to the forward ends of the inner front fenders. I have only seen this in two other convertibles. What is the function of these bars?*

ANSWER: The round bars you described were original. They helped stiffen the very flexible convertible frame. These were not used on coupes and fastbacks, and to my knowledge were only used on the '65 convertible. Over the years these bars were removed by the owners during restoration, and not replaced.

QUESTION: *My gas gauge on my '67 coupe is erratic, the indicator shows near empty when I know the tank is full. Is this due to a faulty gauge or sending unit?*

ANSWER: It has been my experience that very few Gas gauges actually fail. The problem with a faulty reading usually lies with the sending unit. To rule out the gauge being faulty disconnect the fuel tank sending unit wire connected to the sender at the gas tank. Ground the wire on a bolt or stud under the car. If the gauge registers full it is operating properly. Next check the ground connection of the tank, located in the trunk. This ground wire is connected to one of the gas tank mounting bolts. Clean the corrosion from the ground area. If this does not help you will most likely have to replace the sending unit. This is relatively easy and inexpensive.

MINUTES FROM MEETING HELD APRIL 29 1991



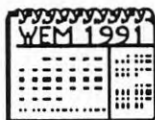
- * The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by president Doria
