Willie Schulz from Creative Connections will be at our July meeting. He has a process to transpose a digital picture of your car on a smaller credit card type base.

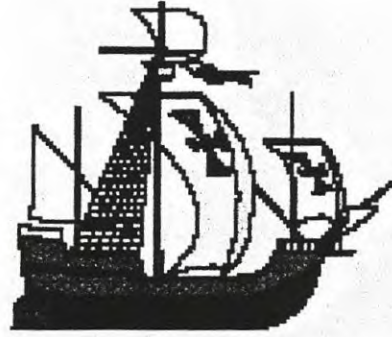

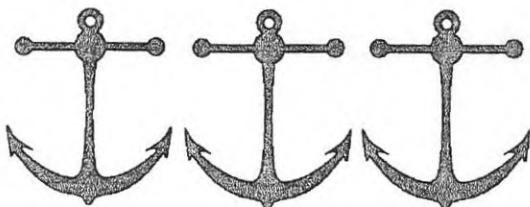


W.E.M. DAY TRIP TO MANITOWOC JULY 29, 2000

TECH Q & A

QUESTION: I have owned three 66 for models for many years. mustang convert -no power brakes, Fairlane 500 coupe no-power brakes, and a 7-liter Galaxie. My problem is the pedal pressure on the Mustang-- almost a 2 footer! My Fairlane has never been a problem. I've rebuilt master and wheel cyls. many times over the years. I would like to copy the sizes on the Fairlane. I don't really want to put a booster on it if i don't have to. I'm sure the Fairlane is a heavier car with much the same parts. If someone could tell me the proper sizes for the Mustang I would be very grateful. Or possibly a smaller bore master than original.

ANSWER: The parts all need to be the stock size to start with. If there is a mismatch of wrong size brake parts on the car, this will affect the stopping distances and pedal effort. Also, power brakes stop with a lot less effort than non-power brakes do. If you are sure the problem is not in the wheel cyls. nor the master cyl. the next thing I would do is to check that the brake pedal is actually working EACH side of EACH of the wheel cyls. Do this by properly jacking and standing the car one wheel at a time. Remove the wheel and brake drum. CAREFULLY hold a large screwdriver perpendicular to the backing plate (blade toward the plate, handle toward you) up against the brake lining and against the outer ring of the backing plate at the 3:00 position. Have an assistant GENTLY and SLOWLY depress the brake pedal. (Don't press too hard or too fast.) The screwdriver will hold back that shoe while you watch the other one. You are looking for movement of each of the pistons of each of the wheel cyls. You will see the brake shoe creep out at the top if everything is working properly. ONCE YOU SEE THE SHOE MOVE, TELL THE PERSON PRESSING ON THE BRAKE PEDAL TO STOP. If you go too far with the brake pedal, the wheel cyl. will blow apart. Repeat this for the 9:00 position and watch the other shoe. If the piston doesn't move the shoe outward, there is some reason the brake fluid's flow is restricted.

QUESTION: What is the temperature gauge (ohm scale range) on the 65-66? I'm trying to determine if my gauge is reading what the sending unit is telling it.

ANSWER: The nominal resistance of a 65-66 temperature gauge is 14 Ohms. Measured on a X-10 scale. Remember that the temp circuit gauge reading depends on the amount of current flowing, in series, through the gauge and sending unit. Many things can influence gauge accuracy. The gauge needle physical position. The wiring in the circuit. The condition of the sending unit. The engine ground. Last but not least, the constant voltage regulator. (When the CVR goes, however, the fuel and oil take a hike in addition to the temp.)

ANSWER: The high side of the gauge is 10 Ohms, and the low side of the gauge is 73 Ohms. Usually an open circuit (unplugging the sending unit) simulates the 73 Ohms, and a shorted circuit (grounding the sending unit wire) simulates the 10 Ohms. Both are to be done with the key "on". If the gauge reads anything but "high" for the 10 Ohms and anything but "low" for the 73 Ohms, there is a problem with the gauge or wiring. Otherwise, the sending unit is no good.
