

We drive right on by wondering what happened, but never take the time to actually read them and maybe learn some obscure, but interesting historical event that once happened there. Mustangs & Markers





In 1673, thirty-nine years after Jean Nicolet visited the Green Bay area. Father Jacques Marquette and Louis Jolliet set out from New France to explore the Mississippi River. They traveled from the Straits of Mackinac between lakes Huron and Michigan to the Fox River at the foot of Green Bay. Two Native American guides led them up the Fox, from which they portaged (at present day Portage) to the river for which the state is named.

Marquette and Jolliet referred to the Wisconsin River as the Miskonsing, Meskousing, Meskous and Miskous, using variations on one of the Native American names for the river. Through the years, the spelling of Wisconsin underwent many changes. By 1800, "Ouisconsin" had become the favorite form for both the river and the region. Finally, in 1845, the Wisconsin territorial legislature officially endorsed "Wisconsin" as the accepted spelling. Many interpretations of the state's name have

Many interpretations of the state's name have been suggested, including "gathering of the waters." "red earth place." "river of a thousand isles." "a good place in which to live." and "at the great point." all of which seem appropriate descriptions of Wisconsin's unique and varied geography.



Wisconsin women rallied to support the Union during the Civil War. They became nurses, hospital matrons, sanitary agents, and ministers. Cordelia A. Perrine Harvey attained national prominence for her role in promoting convalescent aid for sick and wounded soldiers.

convalescent and for sick and wounded soldiers. Cordelia had moved with her family to Southport (Kenosha) in 1840. She married Louis P. Harvey, who became governor in 1862. That April, Governor Harvey drowned while visiting Wisconsin troops wounded at the Battle of Shiloh in Tennessee. Mrs. Harvey thereupon dedicated herself to improving conditions for hospitalized soldiers. She criticized military hospitals for improper sanitation, urging that disabled soldiers be sent northward to medical centers near their homes where care would be better. In 1863 Cordelia Harvey met Abraham Lincoln

In 1863 Cordelia Harvey met Abraham Lincoln and convinced the President to approve the establishment of recuperation hospitals in the North. The first of three such hospitals in Wisconsin opened in Madison. (The other two were in Milwaukee and Prairie du Chien.) The Harvey United States Army Hospital in Madison was redesignated the Wisconsin Soldiers' Orphans Home in 1866. It operated under Mrs. Harvey's direction until 1867, and it closed in 1874.


