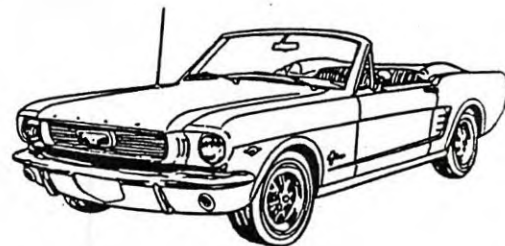

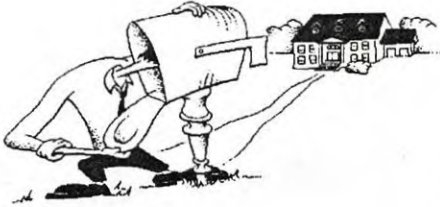
From the Prez.

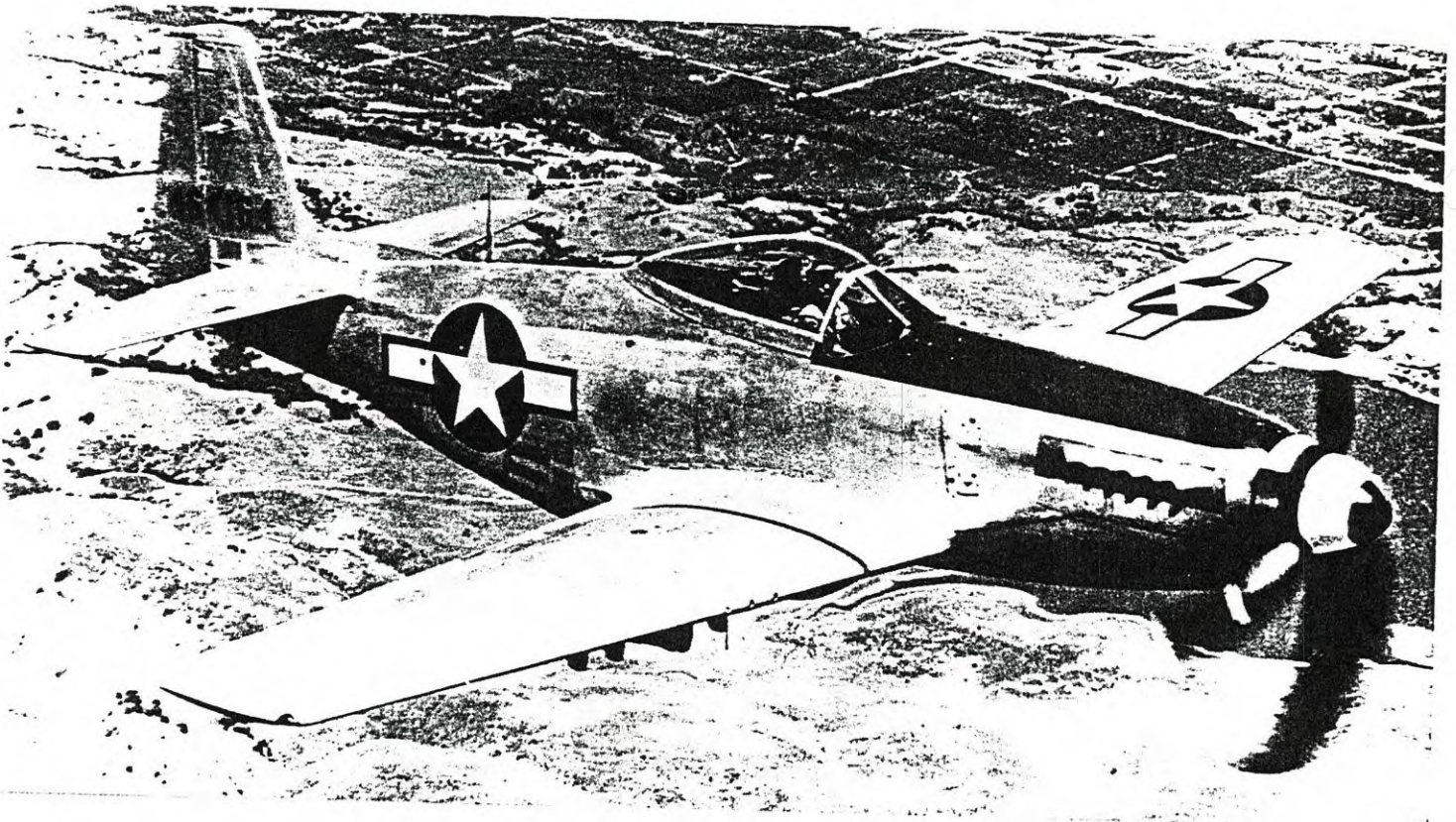
MINUTES FROM MEETING HELD AUGUST 26TH

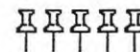

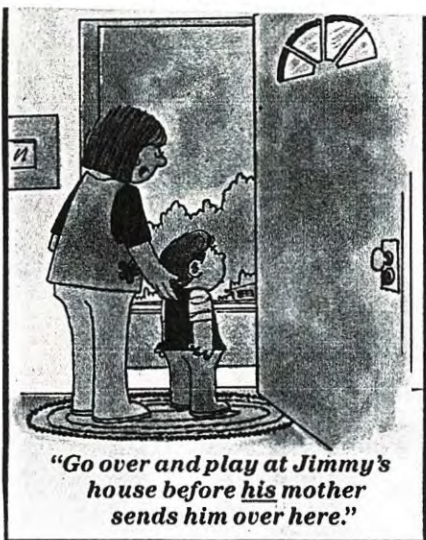
