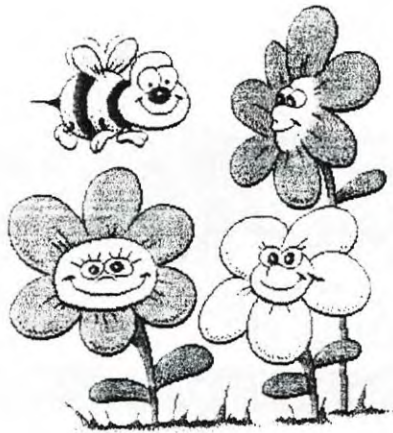
Hi Everyone,

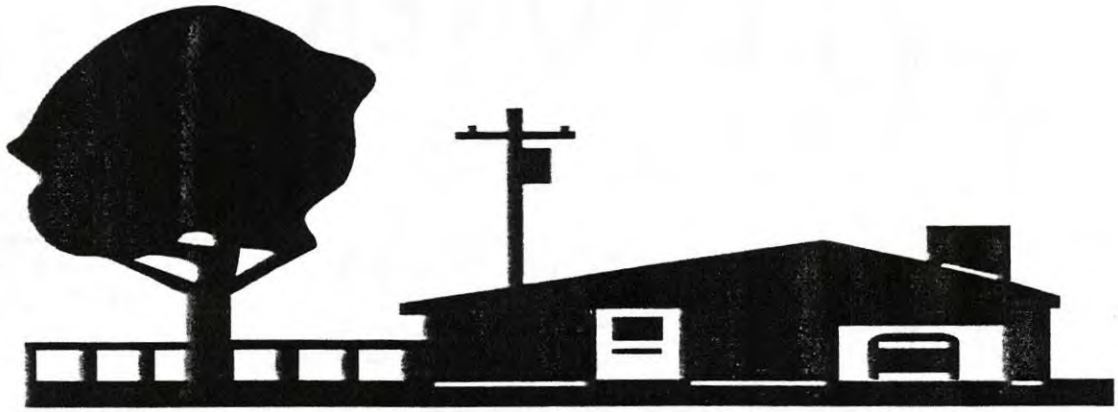


