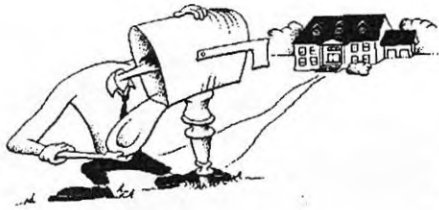

Auto Industry Celebrates Century of Horseless Transportation

J. Frank Duryea used a familiar mode of transportation when, on Sept. 21, 1896, he decided to test drive the horseless carriage he had built. He and his partner, Erwin F. Markham, used horses to tow the vehicle to the intersection of Spruce and Florence streets in Springfield Mass.

They cranked the flywheel hand starter on what now is considered by many to be America's first successful gas powered automobile, then drove it nearly a quarter mile, steering by tiller.

Named for Frank and his brother Charles, the first Duryea, lubricated by Valvoline oil, had leather gears, one cylinder, and wheels with wooden spokes. The Duryea Motor Wagon Company gave birth to the U.S. auto industry two years later by building 13 identical 1896 Duryeas. Oldsmobile generally is given credit for the first mass produced gasoline engine with the Curved Dash Runabout, which sold about 18,000 units between 1901 and 1907. The 700 pound vehicle, with tiller stick steering, had a four horsepower, one cylinder engine mounted under the seat and sold for \$625.

From humble beginnings about 8,000 vehicles registered in 1900. The U.S. automobile industry has grown into an economic giant as it celebrates its 100th anniversary this year. U.S. companies now sell between 8 and 10 million passenger cars a year, somewhat less than the record mark of 11.6 million sold in 1986.

Auto Industries First 100 Years

1896 - Auto industry begins when Duryea Motor Wagon Company manufactures 13 vehicles from one set of plans.

1897 - First automobile insurance sold to Gilbert Loomis: \$7.50 premium for \$1000 coverage.

1900 - First national auto show held at Madison Square Garden.

1903 - Ford Motor Company incorporates.

1908 - General Motors incorporates.

1912 - Standard Oil opens first gas station.

1925 - The Lincoln Highway, the first interstate highway, opened connecting New York to San Francisco.

1927 - Coast to coast bus service begins.

1934 - First drive-in theater opens in Camden NJ.

1941 - UAW organizes 123,000 employees.

1949 - VW Beetle arrives in America

1958 - Toyota and Datsun go on sale for the first time.

1966 - seat belts are mandated, as are energy-absorbing steering columns and dashboards, warning flashers and head restraints on cars, sold in the United States.

1970 - Congress passes Clean Air Act.

1974 - Toyota passes VW in sales.

1982 - Honda begins production in Ohio, the first Japanese automaker to build cars in America.

1984 - Chrysler mini van starts truck mania.

1996 - Auto industry marks 100 years.

- The meeting was adjourned at 7:55

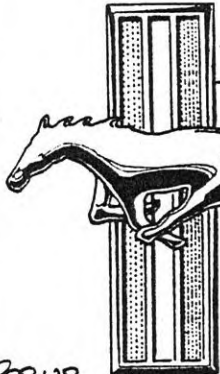

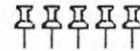
