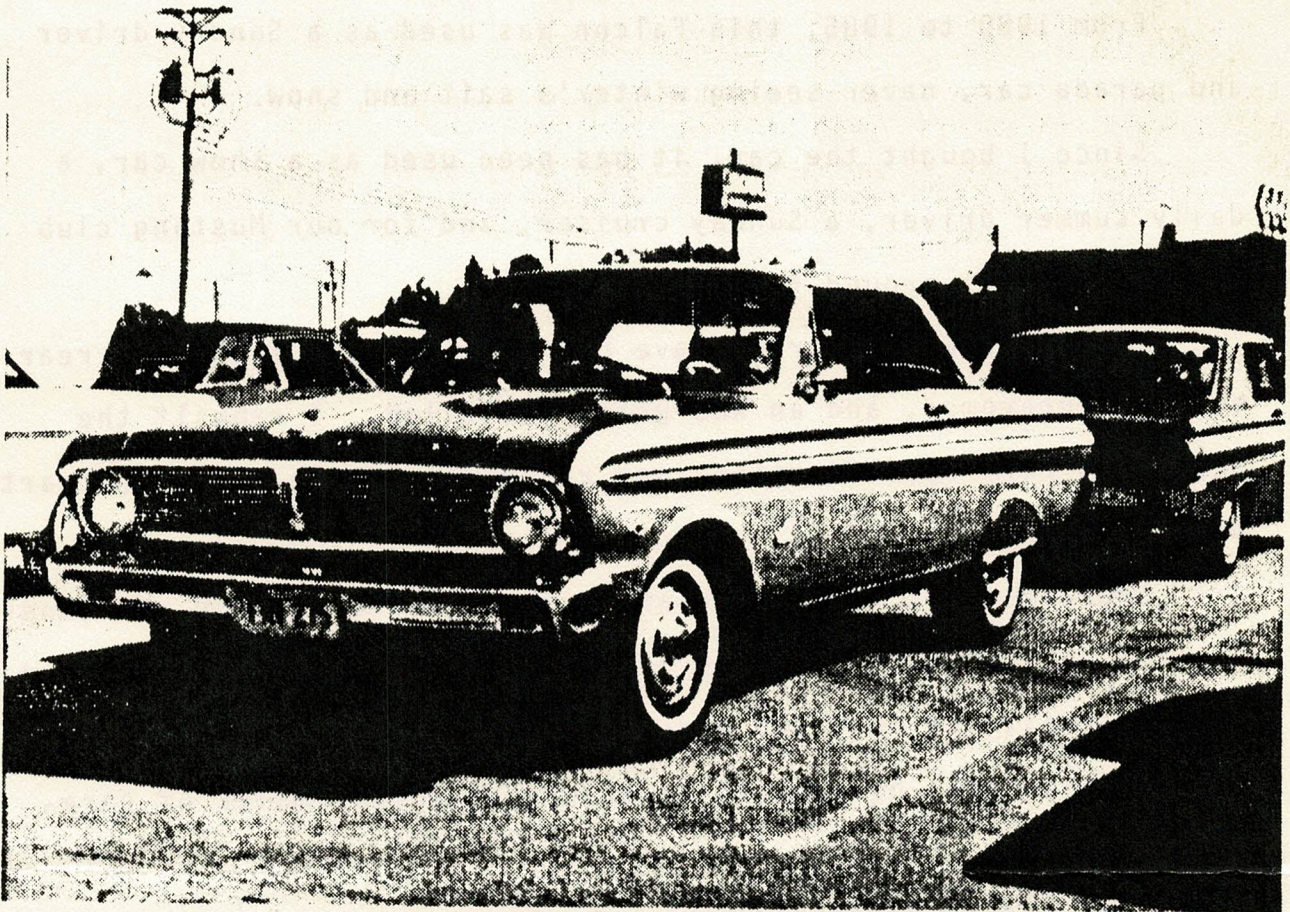

My Falcon was purchased from a co-worker in May, 1985. He found it on the back lot of a California used car dealership during the summer of 1980.

During the drive back to Illinois, the only problem encountered was with the water pump, which died someplace in the middle of Iowa. It was replaced at a small Ford dealership with one that was in a box covered with dust from sitting so long on the shelf, waiting for my Falcon to come for it.

From 1980 to 1985, this Falcon was used as a Sunday driver and parade car, never seeing winter's salt and snow.

Since I bought the car, it has been used as a show car, a daily summer driver, a Sunday cruiser, and for our Mustang club trips -- an all-around fun car.

The interior and trunk have been redone, the front and rear bumpers rechromed, and an NOS grill installed. I rebuilt the engine to Ford specifications and redid the entire engine compartment.

Sometime this winter I plan to install the factory air conditioning unit which is waiting in the garage. Later, as time and money permit, the body and undercarriage will be repainted and the transmission will be rebuilt to ensure many more miles of care-free cruising.

This car is definitely a keeper and will be in our family for a long time to come.
