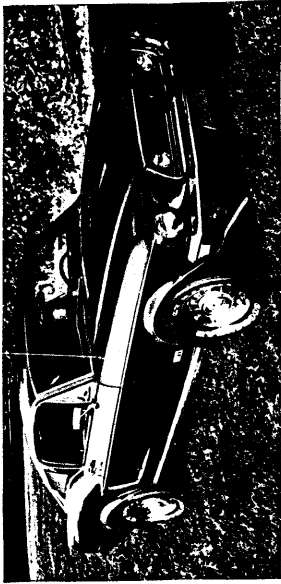


"CAR OF THE MONTH"

It's equipped with a 390 engine which runs a Factory Ford 427 Dual Quad Manifold. On top of that sits 2 Holley 600 cfm carbs. The 4 speed transmission and posi-rear end also help to make it "perform". It's painted Ford Candy Apple Red with a Black "C" Stripes. The interior is black. It has all the GT options that I can think of: Fold-down Rear Seat, Top and Lower Consoles, 8 Grand Tach, Rear GT Aluminum Panel, Woodgrain Dash, Front Spoiler, GT Chrome Wheels. This car took Second Place at the Schwister Ford Car Show this past May. Although I don't want Dale's head to "swell", I can personally say that I think his car is one of the finest in our Club, and also one of the finest on the road today. His hard work has definitely paid off!

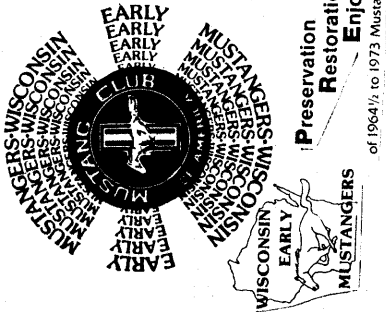

Gar-Wood, Inc., manufactures a complete line of carved reproductions, and their love of automobiles has inspired them to produce a wide selection of car models, including Mustangs. Ah, but there's a catch. Since it would be impossible for everyone to own (afford) an original wood carving, Gar-Wood has developed a unique molding process that reproduces the look, feel, and sound of real wood. Really. Unless you tell, no one will ever know that the cars aren't real wood.
The Mustang detailing is superb, right down to the engine emblems on the fenders. So far, Gar-Wood offers all Mustang hardtop and fastback models from 1965 to 1973, plus a 1965 convertible with other convertibles to come later (tops are up). A 1968 Shelby and 1970 Boss 429 are also available. Two versions are offered: a desk-top pen set on a marble-ite base (\$35.00) and a collector's series on a 3"x8" marble-ite base (\$19.95). A name plate is included with both versions, and a wall plaque is planned for the future.
