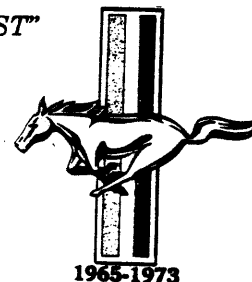


"A FEW TO PRESERVE THE BEST"
